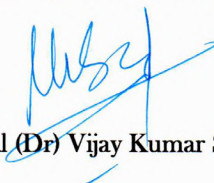

Organization

Mission & Vision

Our Story



Zo Inspiration Foundation was founded on June 7, 2020 during the COVID-19 pandemic. In the beginning, our founder gathered his close and trusted friends to form a 'Core Team' and created a WhatsApp group. Using their own vehicles, they would go out to different towns in Aizawl and across Mizoram to help the underprivileged.

As everything must be carried out according to the

law, we have continuously restructured ourselves to operate more properly and systematically. Now we have our own office and have become a government-recognized Registered Foundation. Moreover, a Board of Directors has also been properly established, and this foundation now operates under their guidance.



Our Mission

One of our key objectives is to take action so that the underprivileged and marginalized, who for various reasons are in poor conditions and cannot keep pace with others, are able to step forward alongside everyone else. Through our programs and projects, we are actively working in various ways in areas such as health, education, livelihood, and housing.



Our Vision

We aim to continue working so that the underprivileged, those rejected or unwanted by society, and those in lower social positions can become self-reliant. We plan to establish a Centre where people who have no place of safety due to drug addiction or other difficulties can come for help, and we are currently looking for a suitable place (Land) for it. We aim to create even more opportunities for those who want to help others but do not know how to reach them. Furthermore, we are firmly committed to being a 'Transparent NGO', trustworthy, and well-organized that people who wish to contribute can rely on.

Organization

Key Strategy

The needy and those requiring assistance usually request help through our Foundation Helpline number and website. We first create a profile for them, then conduct further verification through local NGOs in their village or locality. After that, we carefully and thoroughly carry out a Beneficiary Assessment at their home or another convenient location. Only then do we provide them with assistance.



Temporary Beneficiary Registration



We first collect detailed information about the beneficiaries and enter them into a Temporary Beneficiary profile (TMP), where they are immediately assigned a proper profile ID.

Beneficiary Assessment Review

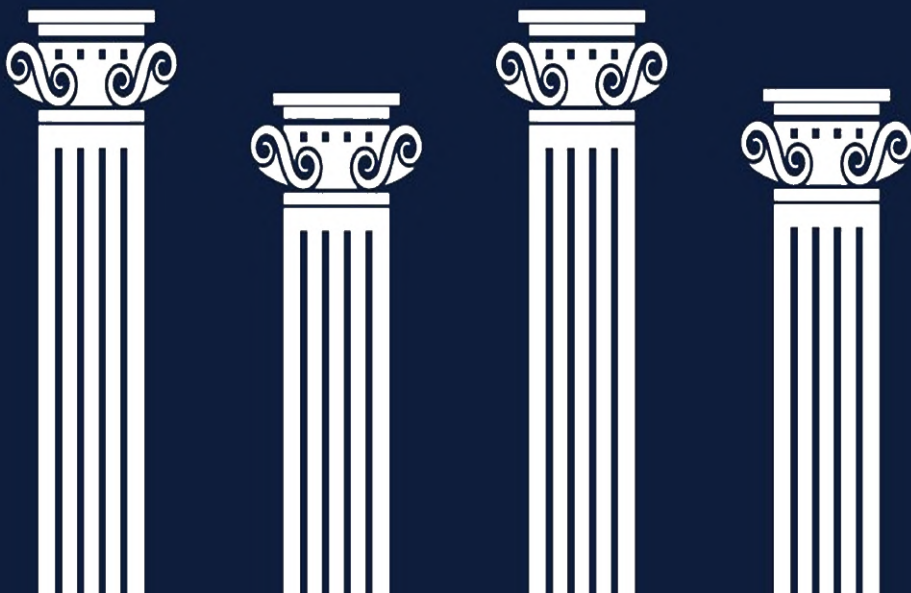


Those entered into the TMP are assessed using the Beneficiary Assessment Form, and the report is then carefully discussed in a meeting or through other convenient means.

Program Placement & Fundraising



After a decision is made, they are enrolled into one of our foundation's programs according to their situation and needs, and then we take necessary action as required.

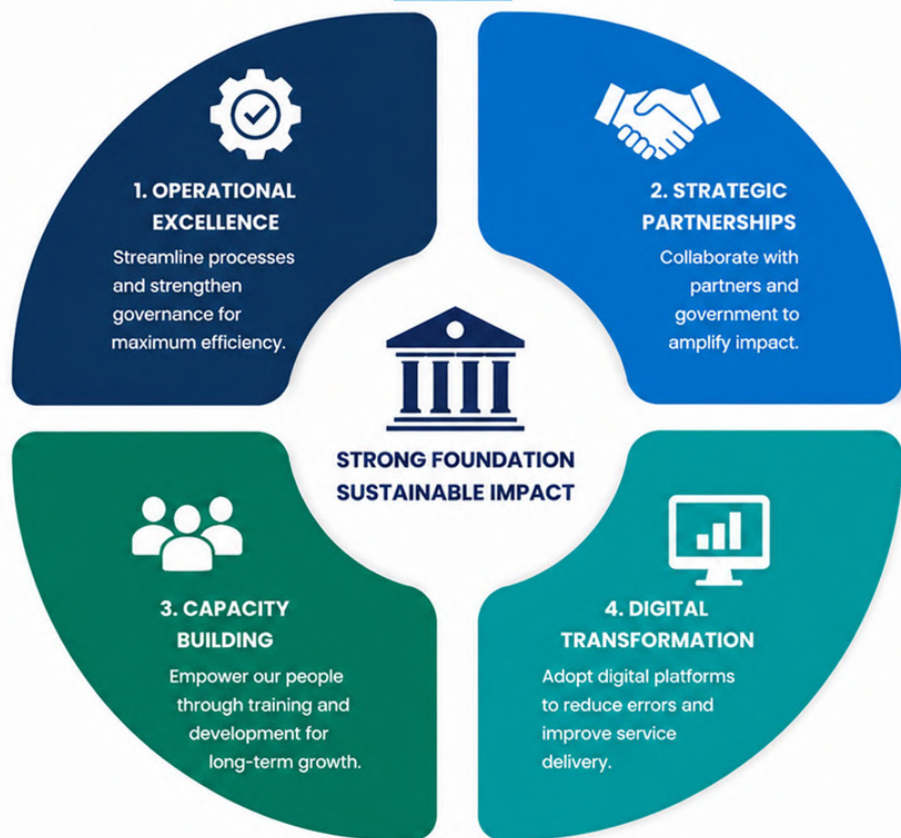


Organization

Core strategic Pillars

1. **Operational Excellence** (*Efficiency*): To ensure we remain a transparent NGO, we follow a strict internal process. Our systems and policies guarantee that every donation is used 100% for its intended purpose, with no waste or misuse, and that it delivers meaningful impact.
2. **Strategic Partnerships** (*Collaboration*): We are continuously working to collaborate as much as possible with other NGOs and various government departments, and we hope this will help us in our future growth and in expanding the scope of our foundation.
3. **Capacity Building** (*People*): To enable us to carry out larger and more efficient initiatives, the staff and volunteers under our foundation are given training from time to time. This has brought great ease and efficiency to our work.
4. **Digital Transformation**: We are gradually moving from a manual system to a digital platform. This will protect us from theft and fraud, as well as from problems that could arise due to human error or negligence.

OUR PURPOSE

Building a resilient organization that creates meaningful, measurable, and lasting change in the communities we serve.

Organization Driven Initiatives

➤ Education

- 01** This initiative addresses underprivileged children across various Mizoram villages who cannot attend school or lack access to proper education, ensuring they receive better educational opportunities. We continue working to discover their potential so they become valuable contributors to church, family, and society.

➤ Health

- 02** Under the 'ZIF Health Program', we actively support patients discouraged by various illnesses to regain new hope. Beyond financial assistance, we provide counseling and undertake diverse interventions based on their needs.

➤ Housing

- 03** Under the 'Shelter of Love Program', homes have been built for 03 widows and orphans without shelter, plus 20 families in severe hardship lacking housing. Local NGOs, groups, and committed individuals have strongly supported this initiative in various ways.

➤ Livelihood

- 04** To ensure underprivileged individuals gain stable and improved livelihoods, we implemented the 'Chicken for Change Program' and constructed grocery shops for 4 families. Additionally, various other initiatives are continuously being pursued.



Social Service & Awareness

A core purpose of establishing this Foundation is to inspire others through good deeds so that kindness and goodwill increasingly flourish within Mizo society. To achieve this, we utilize our social media platforms as effectively as possible.

Additionally, we regularly engage with schools, churches, fellowships, and other venues. Our various initiatives undertaken are showcased on the Big Screen, aiming to inspire the minds of children and youth. This not only strengthens us, but also continually presents us with new challenges.

Under our foundation, we are currently implementing 6 different programs, and we placed our beneficiaries under these programs according to their needs and situation. Also for the financial year 2020-2021 we are launching a new program, the ZIF Health Program, but this program is not included in this annual report.

INITIAL SUPPORT PROGRAM (ISP)

01

Following an assessment, individuals who approach the office with difficulties, or those who contact us via phone calls or messages through our helpline, are enrolled into programs based on their circumstances. Unless the case involves a critical situation or specific hardship requiring substantial financial intervention, assistance is provided through the 'Initial Support Program'.

This program does not have a dedicated source of funding. Funds are allocated as needed from the General Operating Fund (GOF). Under this program, some beneficiaries receive assistance for transportation costs, medication expenses, taxi fares, and other funds to meet their immediate needs.

Furthermore, among the visitors to our office, if there are persons with physical or mental disabilities who do

not qualify for larger-scale interventions, we provide support under this program based on our financial capacity.



Mrs. Lalzirliani lost her sight after suffering from high fever at the age of three. Her husband also has impaired vision in his right eye. Due to their severe hardship, she has resorted to begging in various places. On July 16, 2025, we visited ZMC&H, Falkawn, and presented a donation of ₹7,000 under the Initial Support Program (ISP).



On October 14, 2025, we visited the 'Thutak Nunpuitu Team' in Zuangtui, where we met with the disabled siblings from Hnahva village, who have no close relatives and are under our care through the ISP. During the same visit, we also met with Mr. Thangruaia.



On October 15, 2025, we visited Mrs. Zoramthangi, an 80-year-old woman living alone in Keifang village, and provided her with financial assistance under the ISP. Mrs. Zoramthangi sustains herself by working as a bamboo-splitter.



The family of Mr. T.K. Khupa resides in Dintnar Veng, Champhai. He is separated from his wife and is in very poor health, suffering from seizures. We presented them with a donation on October 7, 2025.



On August 22, 2025, we visited Mr. Laingura and his wife in Thiltlang village. The husband is blind and has hearing impairment, while the wife is also hard of hearing. The childless couple lives alone, and we provided them with assistance under the ISP.





CHARITY PROGRAM (CP)

02

Through the Charity Program (CP), we organize donation drives for individuals selected from reported cases who are suffering from severe illnesses, are critically ill, or are facing extreme hardship. At the same time, we also initiate donation drives upon public request for patients or needy individuals who have drawn significant public sympathy and for whom people wish to provide assistance.

We first conduct a thorough assessment using an assessment form to review their livelihood, family living conditions, number of working members, financial status, and other relevant factors. We also verify their circumstances by contacting NGOs in their locality or village. Under this initiative, we prioritize individuals who have a good chance of survival. In addition, we

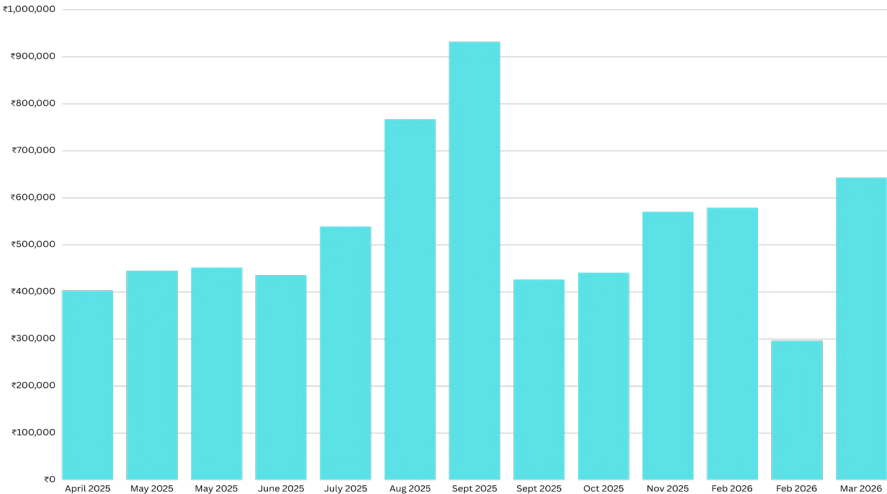
give preference to children and young people who have more of their lives ahead of them. However, we have also supported elderly individuals on numerous occasions, depending on their situation.

Generally, our donation drives do not last longer than 3 days. After the drive concludes, the Finance Department prints the foundation's bank statements for the specific period. Donations received in cash and through online payments are then consolidated, and all amounts are re-verified using the 'Maker Checker System'.

Furthermore, because financial matters require strict care, no one other than the Finance Department handles them, except in cases of special necessity.

FREE EDUCATION PROGRAM (FEP)

03

This program is an initiative for underprivileged children not only in Aizawl but also in various towns of Mizoram. It is an intervention for children who wish to attend good schools but face difficulties due to poor family circumstances, lack of proper guardians, and inability to enroll in quality educational institutions.

This program was initiated in 2024, and during the previous year 2025-2026, we continued supporting 49 students under this program. While separate donations are received specifically for this purpose, they remain very limited considering the number of children. Therefore, their financial needs are often disbursed from the General Operating Fund (GOF).

Of the 49 children under this program during 2025-2026, 18 students resided within Aizawl district, while 31 students resided outside Aizawl District.

As the academic year concluded, the children's results were gradually released, and fortunately 19 students passed with distinction, while 13 students passed in first division. Meanwhile, some of our children, however, could not progress satisfactorily in their education due to unfavorable family circumstances.

During 2025-2026, ₹3,03,851/- was spent on admission fees & uniforms, and ₹5,72,330/- was spent on monthly fees and other expenses, totaling ₹8,76,181/- expended under this program.

On February 28, 2026, we visited Primary School-1 at Sihphir and met their teachers because there were 'underprivileged students' among their pupils who could potentially be supported under the Free Education Program (FEP).



On April 15, 2025, we signed an agreement at their office with Home Missions School, Zemabawk, for one-year collaboration under FEP, and under this program the school provide free hostel accommodation for 7 students for one academic session.



We visit our children supported under FEP at their hostel every second Saturday of each month. We purchase items they request, discuss their difficulties and their progress. Additionally, we also hold sessions for encouragement and prayer together.



We also visit the orphan siblings from Ruantlang whom we placed at Divine Intervention School on every hostel visiting day. Considering how we began, we have truly made significant progress.



On July 25 2025, we took our children under FEP out from their hostel, shared dinner together at Mualpui, Aizawl, and since they were departing for holidays, we encouraged them to be valuable contributors to their families.





SHELTER OF LOVE PROGRAM (SLP)

04

This program is one of the flagship initiative at the inception of our foundation, and when this foundation was established in 2020, using donations received in memory of Lalhruaizela (L) of Samtlang village, a house for his bereaved family was already built.

Among our beneficiaries, those without homes who are especially needy and for whom dedicated donations were received have continually had houses built for them. Until the past year 2025-2026, we have already built as many as 23 houses. Some of our constructed houses, however, were not entirely new builds but renovations (renovate) as well.

Those for whom we build houses are generally widowed families or disabled persons, especially particularly poor families. The construction is always done in collaboration with their village NGOs, and there have already been numerous individuals and groups who volunteered generously for our building projects.

The beneficiaries under this program are mostly poor families who own no house plots or land at all, therefore we first verify with their village council for land to build on, and only when they approve can we then proceed. Because house plots are very difficult and costly to obtain, undertaking this program near towns is particularly challenging.

Our built houses are constructed to be as uniform as possible, including the color and design pattern, and even their size, all built to be as equal as possible.

Generally we build for around 30 days, and before construction begins we make a proper detailed plan with their village NGOs on how to proceed, and joint meetings are called as necessary. In villages where we receive strong support from local NGOs, the work is much easier and faster.

LIGHTHOUSE INITIATIVE PROGRAM (LIP)

The Lighthouse Initiative Program is an effort to help vulnerable families secure better and more sustainable livelihoods. Widows, orphans, single-parent households, and especially impoverished families are given priority.

For some, we establish grocery shops as startup support for their livelihoods and provide the initial capital required.

For others, we carefully assess how their existing skills can be utilized effectively. We have provided sewing machines in the past, and in addition, we have also awarded Two Wheeler Taxis.

Furthermore, for those interested in pig rearing, we purchase piglets for them, construct pigsties, and enable them to rear pigs. Some have even slaughtered pigs to offer us gratitude.

Beyond these, in late 2025 we implemented Chicken For Change (CFC) and supported 16 families with poultry rearing. Fortunately, we all saw excellent results, their chickens reached maturity and sold very well, and they plan to reinvest the proceeds to purchase more chicks and continue.

Overall, we believe they have broadly benefited, but for this new year 2025–2026, we do not intend to continue Chicken For Change (CFC) for now, and plan to focus on other initiatives.

On September 23, 2025, under LIP we convened our Chicken For Change beneficiaries at our office and conducted a productive Training and Beneficiaries Meet programme.



Widow Pi Vungngaihmani of Thingdawl village was supported with piglets to start her livelihood, and a pigsty was arranged for her. This has been very useful and, by God's grace, is progressing well so far.



At Lawipu BSUP, widow Pi Lalbiakmuani, as requested, was provided with assorted goods to set up a small shop within her home, and these have been very beneficial to her.



Widow Pi Lalpianthangi was assisted with rented accommodation in Bethlehem Vengthlang, and to start her livelihood we provided vegetables to sell from home along with a weighing scale. These have been very useful to her.



Since our beneficiary Kiana Zomuansangi has passed away, the remaining gifts intended for her were, as requested by her parents, used to purchase a Two Wheeler Taxi on November 11, 2025 to help them start a livelihood.





CHRISTMAS CHARITY PROGRAM (CCP)

06

Since the foundation was established in 2020, we have conducted the Christmas Charity Program every year-end during the festive season. To enable underprivileged families without means for Christmas shopping to also celebrate a joyful and peaceful festive season, we distribute gifts (cash and goods) and reach out to assist those in need.

Last year, 2025, we ran this program from November 26 to December 23. Below are the projects undertaken last year under this program:

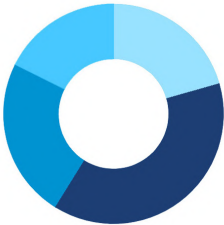

On November 26, 2025, the first outreach of the Christmas Charity Program (CCP) for the year 2025 was conducted. Ten of us departed from our office premises and visited various villages in Khawzawl District to distribute gifts.



On November 26, 2025, we undertook our second outreach under the Christmas Charity Program (CCP). For distributing Christmas gifts, we made three trips, visited 43 villages, reached 95 families, and disbursed gifts worth ₹5,61,169.



On December 12, 2025, at Chawnhu village, we gathered 35 senior citizens and 128 children and distributed Christmas gifts of toys and blankets. We shared a joyful and memorable occasion together.



On December 10 and 11, 2025, at our office, we distributed substantial quantities of rice and groceries free of cost to 667 families for Christmas. We consider it highly worthwhile.



On December 20, 2025, at our office premises in Chanmari, Aizawl, together with SAY and Chanmari Choir, we distributed 500 plates of sawhchiar and tea to passersby for Christmas. We found it delightful and believe the public deeply appreciated it.

For our foundation to continue operating, we consistently require funds for administrative purposes. Contributions received specifically for this purpose are termed 'Administration Funds'.

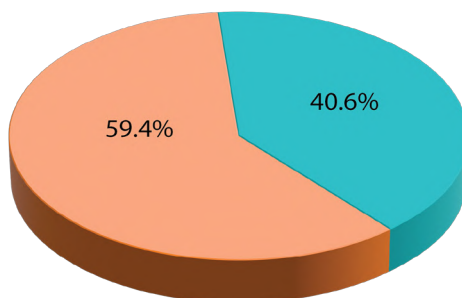

Since our beneficiaries often include illiterate individuals and those needing assistance in safeguarding money, we provide 'Financial Management' support to ensure incoming donations for them are used appropriately and remain secure.



Because most of our initiatives involve handling funds, great caution is necessary. When an initiative occurs, our Finance Department at the Office creates a separate Cash Book for them, where all inflows and outflows related to them are carefully recorded.

Due to this Financial Management support we provide, during the past FY 2025-2026, expenditures were lower than income. This resulted from safeguarding their incoming funds and placing some in Fixed Deposits for them.



From this new FY 2026-2027, we plan to conduct Financial Training for our beneficiaries as circumstances permit, and we expect this will help us to some extent.

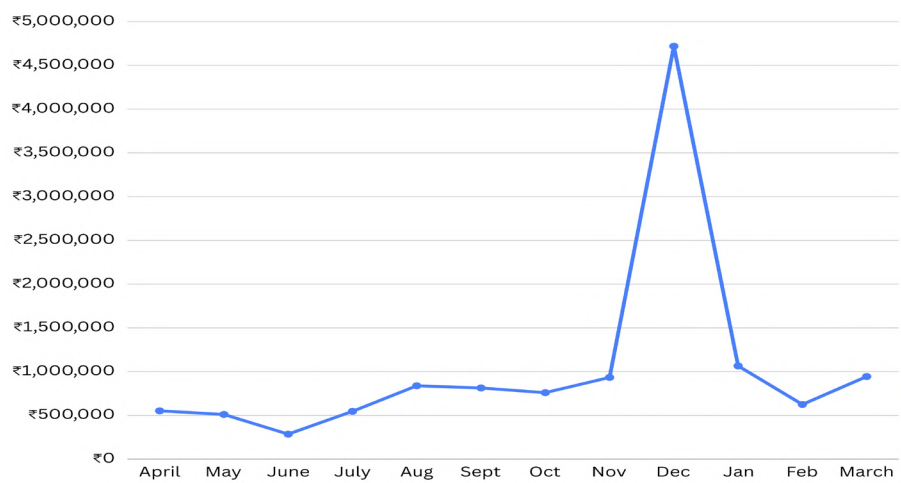

SUCCESS STORIES

EDENTHAR-I BEN ID: CP/25-01-001

A brief background

Edenthari was born on February 12, 2012, to Mr. Daniel and Mrs. Suimeni in Zawngtetui village, as their third child. The family sustains themselves through agriculture, and her parents work in their fields almost daily, toiling continuously.

Onset of Illness

Until the age of 12, she attended school without any health complaints. In late October 2024, while in class eight, she returned home from school one afternoon extremely tired and unusually lethargic, though initially it caused no serious concern. However, from that day onward, she became dull and listless every evening, yet surprisingly, she would appear normal again each morning.

Her mother, Mrs. Suimeni, grew troubled by her daughter's changing condition and took her to Bungzung Hospital, then to Champhai Civil Hospital. But since no improvement occurred, they returned to their village. As her condition still did not improve, they desperately sought Dr. Nghaktea in Zokhawthar, yet there was still no real progress, leaving her parents utterly hopeless.



Determined not to give up, despite visiting multiple places without relief from her illness, they borrowed money and traveled from their village to ZMC, Falkawn.

There, various investigations were conducted, and she required frequent blood transfusions. Edenthari was growing increasingly weak from her illness, but being a lively and resilient child, she continued to endure by God's grace.

To obtain the blood she needed, her father would travel without regard for midnight from Falkawn to collect blood from Durtlang Synod Hospital Blood

Bank. Even after shifting to Zemabawk Cancer Hospital, she received 4-8 units of blood daily, and it is known that she had received as many as 120 transfusions. Since only one attendant was permitted in the hospital ward, and having no other helper, her father, Mr. Daniel, often slept on the hospital veranda.

Blood Cancer

While at ZMC, her father Mr. Daniel went back to their village. Upon reaching Keifang, he received a phone call informing him that his daughter's test results were out and, unfortunately, she had blood cancer. He found it extremely hard to accept! Instead of continuing home, he turned back toward Aizawl. At that time they were at ZMC, Falkawn, and shortly after, they shifted to Zemabawk Cancer Hospital.

At Zemabawk, she underwent various therapies, including chemotherapy and other necessary treatments. Eden suffered from Hematochezia (persistent rectal bleeding) and had lost six teeth. Before administering chemotherapy, even the doctors had little hope, and they candidly explained everything to her parents.

Eden received much affection and support, and while at Zemabawk Cancer Hospital, she had already received several gifts from sympathizers.

How we met

While they were moving between Zemabawk Hospital and ZMC, Dr. Elizabeth Fanai, a pediatrician at ZMC, learned of their hardship and distress and referred the case to the Zo Inspiration Foundation. Our CFO immediately went for an assessment and handed over a cash gift of Rs. 5,000/-. From then on, we became acquainted.

After a thorough assessment, considering their difficulty and her critical condition, we launched a charity collection for her under our Charity Program on January 27, 2025. A total of Rs. 4,95,532/- (four lakh ninety-five thousand five hundred thirty-two) was raised for her.

These donations were handed over on January 31, 2025, at Zemabawk Cancer Hospital. With these funds, Edenthari continued to receive treatment up to the time of this report, and her condition has been gradually improving. Her unwavering trust in God despite having cancer is remarkable and deeply moving to us.



A brief background

Ella Zothantluangi is the youngest of the 3 children from Pu Lalnunfela and Pi Lalthahmingmawii, born on September 2nd, 2024 in Kolasib. She is currently residing in Kolasib, Gosen veng, Ella's father Pu Lalnunfela works many jobs, while having a farm that both he and his wife take care of.

Onset of Illness

Born in ZMC, Ella was born with a slipped disc and had to have surgery before she was even 2 weeks old. The doctors said the reason for her slipped disc was because there was water on the brain.

Through God's will Ella had a successful surgery however having had a severe surgery at her age meant her body was vulnerable to further ailments, as was told to her parents. After reaching her home town, Ella's head kept swelling and swelling, her family approached Kolasib hospital and they were referred to ZMC yet again.

How we met

In October 2025, Ella stayed with her parents as they worked on the farms, a person coming home from work saw Ella and her unfortunate ailment and felt a lot of sympathy, the person told Ella's story to our Foundation for her.



After an Assessment was made, Ella's family were instructed to come to Aizawl as soon as possible and they were told their expenses and necessities would all be accommodated through us.

Then, at the end of October in ZMC, Ella had a successful surgery. Now her head is gradually getting better, not having any more worrisome complaints even at the time of writing this, God has kept her safe and in healing.

Ella's parents could not stop their work due to their financial circumstances, due to this they had to let Ella stay with them in their work. However, nowadays with the help of some very selfless people, their hopelessness turned into aspiration, their tears of sorrow have become tears of joy. This was possible through God and His selfless followers.

A brief background

Being the youngest of 4 kids of Pi Nuthangi and Pu Tharzela, Pi Vanrohlui was born on May 4th, 1993 in the town of Kepran.

Growing up in Kepran, she married in 2016, having 2 wonderful daughters, after the birth of the 2nd daughter in 2021, Pi Vanrohlui's husband left her and their two daughters, leaving her to be a widow. They are currently residing in Falkawn renting a house.

Hard times

In 2021 when her younger daughter was born, it was found that Pi Vanrohlui had gotten HIV from her husband, fortunately her two daughters however did not get afflicted.

Her husband leaving her in 2021 made Pi Vanrohlui to give it her all to take care of her 4 year old daughter and baby who isn't even a month old yet as she held them while selling soapwater to earn money.

Sitting in front of people's shops near ZMC gate and selling all kinds of stuff like Frooti, Zarda and Mitha pan, Pi Vanrohlui gave her daughter sugar water because she feared her breastmilk could pass on the HIV. Eating one meal a day was very common for her.



How we met

In early 2022, we heard her story and started work, to let her have a proper start in earning money we talked with Falkawn VC and the YMA tonwork together and make a food store called "Hope & Faith Variety Store" through the aid of selfless donations. In April 28th, 2022 the opening and giving to God for His blessing was held.

Through her shop, Pi Vanrohlui has got most of her and her daughters' necessities in possession, she has also bought her required supplies in surplus as well. Then, in 2025 we bought 30 chicks for her to take care of, with the money we sent her to build a house she used it to make a great chicken house, with our support she has become very fruitful as both she and her daughters step out into the world.

PC LALROHLUA

ISP/25-10-199

A brief background

PC Lalrohlua is the 2nd child of Pu Lalbiakmawia and Pi Lalremruatkimi, born in August 28th, 2025, when he was born he was 3.47 Kilograms in weight, Rohlua was very healthy and adorable. Currently residing in West Phaileng, Dintar he lives under his grandparent's house, his father Pu Lalbiakmawia also works in any kind of necessary job.

Onset of Illness

From when he was just born and growing to be a week old, Rohlua had no ailments, however after his first week his breath became accelerated and he started going out of breath. They approached Phaileng hospital and they continued to take care of him at home, but not long after Rohlua became very sick, again with very accelerated breath. They found out that he had Pneumonia and since he could not get better they came to Aizawl for treatment.

After approaching Dr. Isaac Lallawmkima, they found he had a puncture in his heart. The left side if his heart's vein had punctured and was leaking blood into the right side of the heart, since there was nothing they could do in Mizoram the doctors referred them to quickly go to the mainland.

Because their family's earning was through shopkeeping a small store,



Rohlua's father was very worried but they never stopped praying. This was a crucial part of their resilience and faith.

How we met

In October 10th, 2025 a person came to our Foundation to tell us about Lalrohlua and his family's situation, our foundation called them to inquire more about their problems to know more about how we could help them.

We found that there was no medical aid they could get from Mizoram and that they had to fly abroad, through our Initial Support Program(ISP) we made preparations for them to reach the mainland hospitals.

In November 1st, 2025 we drove them to the Lengpui Airport, at 11:55am in noon they flew out to Kolkata. Through God's

will they reached their destination safely, staying in Mapui Home Stay, the family all lived together in a room.

In November 3rd, 2025 he was taken to BM Birla Heart Research Centre, and Dr. Kuntal Roy Chowdhuri, who was treating him, even said, 'If you had been even a day late, we might not have been able to save his life.'

The next day, November 4, 2025, around 3 PM, he was wheeled into the operating theater (OT) for surgery. After 6 hours of operation, the surgery was successfully completed. He was then immediately moved to the ICU and stayed there for 10 days. He was cared for with close attention and caution, and even his own mother, who was his caregiver, was only allowed to visit him very rarely.

After ten days, because he was recovering very quickly, he was moved to the general ward. They then stayed for some time at the Mizo Guest House, and had two follow-up check-ups at the hospital. As soon

as the doctors said they could return to Mizoram, his mother excitedly told us, 'We'll be able to come home soon,' and gave us an update on his condition.

This is the blessing of the Lord on our prayers and on our best efforts for this poor child, even after we had lost hope. The total amount of donations received and spent under the Initial Support Program (ISP) for him is ₹55,872 (fifty-five thousand eight hundred seventy-two).

In Mizoram

On November 26, 2025, we coordinated with our foundation and made all the necessary arrangements. We booked their flight tickets at the last minute, and on November 26, 2025, they arrived in Aizawl along with Joshua Lalremsanga and his family, who also underwent heart surgery. We are truly grateful for this.

About Joshua

Joshua Lalremsanga was born on January 31, 2024 at Aizawl Civil Hospital as the third child of Pu Lalmalsawma and Pi VL Remruatthangi. They currently reside at Luangmual Industry Veng.

Onset of illness

Two weeks after his birth, he developed a cold and cough. His breathing became rapid and he coughed a lot, so they took him to their local Urban Health Centre hoping he would recover soon. One day while he was sleeping in the afternoon, he suddenly cried out, had a seizure, his whole body stiffened, and his face turned blue.

As this kept happening repeatedly, he was taken to Aizawl Civil Hospital where he was diagnosed with pneumonia. He was admitted to the hospital and underwent various tests, but his condition didn't improve much.

He was then taken to Dr. Loncy, a Cardiologist's clinic. After an Echo was done, it was found that he has a hole in his heart. On Dr. Loncy's advice, he started taking heart medication. However, his fever and cold still did not go away.



Thankfully, during their 5th checkup, Dr. Loncy told them that the smaller hole in his heart had already closed. His parents were very relieved and happy. However, they were also informed that the larger hole is quite wide, and if surgery is not done soon, his condition could worsen

How we met:

Since Joshua needed surgery and it couldn't be done in Mizoram, Joshua's parents, Pu Lalmalsawma and Pi VL Remruati, were very distressed. They were also facing financial difficulties. So on October 26, 2025, they came to our office and shared their struggles with us. We understood how much help they needed, and seeing how difficult their situation

was, we immediately started making the necessary arrangements. We arranged their travel to the mainland, their flight tickets, and their accommodation. After completing everything required, on November 1, 2025, our staff saw them off at Lengpui Airport as they departed for BM Birla Heart Research Centre (BMBHRC), Kolkata. We also gave them money for their expenses.

Joshua's parents and Pi VL Remruati traveled to Kolkata along with another child, Pi VL Remruati's child, Pu Lalmalsawma's child, who also needed heart surgery. On November 1, 2025, they arrived at BM Birla Heart Research Centre (BMBHRC), Kolkata. On November 5, 2025, Joshua underwent heart surgery which lasted for about 5 hours. Thankfully, the surgery was successful, and he was moved to the ICU for recovery. The doctors said his condition is stable now and he is recovering well.

Mizoram-ah

On November 26, 2025, they returned to Aizawl. Our staff welcomed them at Lengpui Airport and we met safely. After coming back to Aizawl, they met Dr. Loncy again and did a follow-up Echo. The result was very good, and we are truly grateful. Now he is a healthy child, celebrating his 2nd year at Luangmual Industry Veng.

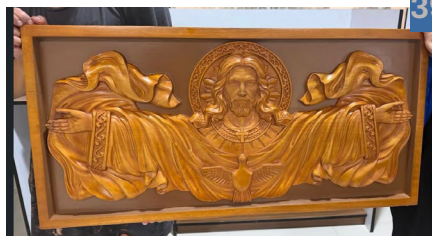

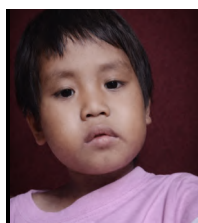

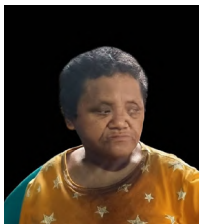
